November 30: The First Sunday of Advent

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

'They shall beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.' From the earliest days of the Church, Isaiah has been recognized as the prophet who speaks most clearly of the coming of Christ. The Church Fathers loved today's text. For Ireneus of Lyons, writing in 180 AD, the fact of the nations beating their



weapons into instruments of peace was a sign that that the word of the prophet was spoken of the Prince of Peace. Our Lord, he says, made the plough and introduced the pruning-hook. 'The plough refers to the creation of Adam and Eve, the sowing of the seed of humankind. The pruning-hook speaks of the gathering-in of the produce in the last times by the Word, and, for this reason, since Jesus joined the beginning to the end, and is Lord of both, he has finally joined the wood to the iron, as the Word is united to flesh and in its mechanism fixed with pins, he has reclaimed the savage earth.'
